Our early newsletters were hand typed on this manual typewriter without any inbuilt correction. County Cllr Report

General Election month

Saw the historic local election of Basingstoke's first Labour MP, Luke Murphy.

Luke popped into the Councillor Chat at the Brookvale Village Hall and residents were able to ask him lots of burning questions. I'm sure he will be making more drop-in visits so do come along on the 2nd Saturday of every month if you have questions or issues to raise.

At county level I have already been getting support from our new MP on issues like the Hospital and the performance of our GPs locally. This is really welcome. I am still collecting information from residents with my big GP survey and you can take part here: https://basingstokelabour.org/gp-feedback-survey/

Problems with your Landlord?

Most of the time tenants and landlords have good relationships and properties are maintained to a good level. But when things go wrong it can be difficult to know where to turn.

Landlords are expected to be responsible for most major repairs in the property such as the structure of the property like windows doors, roofs, pipes and wiring. They should also be responsible for sinks, baths, toilets, heating, hot water, boilers and gas and electric appliance safety.

You can often get your problem solved quickly by speaking to your housing association, landlord or their letting agent first. Explain what you are unhappy about (take pictures if you can) and ask them to sort out the problem. If there is no action you can then make a formal complaint which is best done in writing.

Nealy all Housing Associations are signed up to the Housing Ombudsman scheme and have to have a formal complaints procedure. The Ombudsman has recently introduced tougher requirements on complaints, and they must be acknowledged within five days and resolved ten days after that. If you're not happy with the response they **must** provide a stage 2 complaint after which you can complain to the Ombudsman.

It is now possible for a third party to make the complaints on your behalf, this could be a Local Councillor or Citizens Advice or even a friend.

Any problem that affects your health or safety like mould, lack of heating or water, gas leaks or pest infestations, can be reported to the Council's Environmental Health Department who have legal powers to deal with landlords, including Housing associations.

The Citizens Advice are a great place to start if you need some friendly advice and you're not sure where to start or if you have an unresponsive private landlord.
