Throughout the early years, the original BCA 18 volunteers held 65 different events and activities.

After this first full year of activities, the association's first AGM was held on February 24th 1975 in Eaton's Sports & Social Club (old Thornycroft Canteen opposite the Thornycroft factory gate—now entrance to the Thornycroft Trading Estate opposite Morrisons').

County Cllr Report

The Devolution Consultation is now open. Devolution is where Government passes down some national powers and extra funding to our region. There is an elected Mayor, and a Strategic Authority made up of local councils who work together to use the devolved powers and funding. This is not a new council and does not replace existing councils. It is easier to think of it as a board of directors made up of councillors from local member councils. The voting arrangements for decisions is

a simple majority in favour, including the Mayor. So, a Mayor cannot just ride roughshod over other members. Graphic:

With devolution, the new Strategic Authority with have regional duties and powers in things like investment, economic development, transport, local infrastructure, skills and employment, environment, climate change, health and wellbeing and public safety.

Devolution brings great benefits. Local councils in Hampshire will not have to bid against each other for pots of money from national government but will work together to deliver strategies and funding for the whole area. No more competing against each other for funding for things like public transport, economic growth, or tackling deprivation. Competitive bidding often means parts of Hampshire Basingstoke lose out while others gain. Devolution will enable us to create joined-up strategies for us all.

Rob Young of Status Quo Opens Brookvale Hall in 1983

You might know that Basingstoke

had a 'music scene and wondered what happened then?

It is not well known nowadays that famous music bands used to local perform at Basingstoke venues, most now gone.

In a classic case of "who you know", here are the official new hall opening pictures in 1983, nearly 10 years after the formation of the BCA, to raise funds to build our community hall.

Below you see Chair Tom Gilvear and Rob Young the band's tour manager and harmonica player (both accompanied by the previous Chair Vic Humphries), reading the introductions. Note both the eldest and the youngest residents!

Robert Keith Young (born 16 1945), May musician & writer became famous for being the unofficial fifth member of the British rock band Status Quo.

A Thornycroft tool maker, he started in the music business as a crew member for Amen Corner, The Nice and also for The Herd and was then hired by Status

The British rock group Quo are best known in UK for their "heads-down" 12-bar boogie rock played since the 70s. Several of Quo's hits, including "Caroline", "Paper Plane" and "Down Down," were written by vocalist Francis Rossi with Rob Young band tour manager and harmonica player.

The Guinness Book Records shows Quo played four venues in one day (Sheffield International Centre, Glasgow Scottish Exhibition & Conference Birmingham Centre, National Exhibition Centre & Wembley Arena) as part of their 1991 Rock You Drop tour 25th anniversary commemoration.
