This talk by Bob Clarke is to mark the 250th anniversary of the birth of Jane Austen. Jane was born in 1775 at Steventon and lived there until moving to Bath in 1801. From 1796 she wrote a series of letters to her sister, Cassandra, who was living in Kent, some of which describe her visits to Basingstoke. Bob will describe what Basingstoke was like during those years Jane was living here and writing to Cassandra, and what Jane did and who she met on her visits to Basingstoke.

Patient Participation Group (PPG) for Camrose, Gillies, Hackwood & Beggarwood

The PPG were given a presentation on Phone & Continuity of Care Improvements. Last month the practice introduced their new team working and phone routing system. Each patient should now have been informed by letter or text who their named GP is and which team they work in. If you don't know please ask next time you contact the surgery. Stephen Collier the practice manager has reassured us that if you get through to the wrong team, the staff member will still deal with your enquiry without having to transfer you. Continuity of care should improve as you will be dealing with the same team each time you contact the practice. Keep a note of your GP and the team colour name. We knew this would cause some disruption, but the practice has minimized this. Many patients report a better and faster experience contacting the practice, but some are still experiencing issues, with long wait times on the phone and routine appointments being booked 28 days or more from contacting the practice. Although this may not be ideal, it enables more dinically urgent appointments to be available when needed. If the allocation to a particular team is causing significant issues for you please use the complaints system to discuss a solution. HCC & BDBC are working on the Central Govt demanded, Devolution & Local Govt re-organisation options to be consulted. Our residents are asked to ensure everyone responds to both consultations (or to their Ward/County Clirs): www.basingstoke.gov.uk/future-councils



The good news is the **Borough** could gain more funding importance as County strategic matters come one layer down, nearer to residents, if in a new Unitary with Hart & Rushmoor; but the bad news is that we may have pay more Council Tax, because Hart and Rushmoor residents currently pay higher Council Tax!

The **researched data** (PWC) shows most likely financially stable & robust impact in Option B (3 mainland+loW) against UK Gov criteria: people first, population, boundaries, administration, efficiency, savings, continuity, costing, payback & risk, would be: BDBC, Hart, Rushmore, Winchester, & East Hampshire as a combined authority:

The **County** considers the 4 unitaries (3 mainland+loW) option a simpler, stronger & secure council option for the new Hampshire & Solent-Hampshire County Combined Mayoral Council.


Their **financial analysis** showed 5 New Councils (4 mainland +loW) is the most risky, costs the most to implement, makes no savings and would cost more to run in the future (risking bankruptcy). The **County decisions** are scheduled

17th July (Cllrs) & 18th (Cabinet) July.
If approved then the public will be consulted from 21 July—17 August.

Hampshire Councils then submit their preferred option to central government by 26th Sept.ember 2025.
