Thornycroft Clock Project

The Thornycroft vehicle factory was at Worting Road, Brookvale, on the site of Morrison's and B&M. The factory made large industrial and military vehicles. Thornycroft were the town's major employer for 60 years who also complained to the Council about insufficient housing and poor water sanitation.

The original three faced external clock mounted on the main factory building for worker's timekeeping, was rescued when the old factory works were demolished in the 1990s. The clock was then preserved (with some funding from Safeway) by the County Museum who display the clock in Milestones, Basingstoke.

In 2011 The Brookvale Community Association (BCA) received Council development grant funding that enabled the Brookvale Village Hall to be extensively enlarged with the main work being completed in July 2014. The design and approved planning permission artist's impressions included the Thornycroft Clock Tower on the western end of the new roof. The internal lift shaft is built strong enough with a concrete top to support the clock tower, roof and cladding, with a power supply.

THE THORNYCROFT CLOCK PROJECT FUND launched at the 2017 Thornycroft Show, to pay for the design, manufacture, installation and commissioning of a four faced replica and clock tower. The materials will include a low maintenance, low running cost modern reliable clock mechanism that does not need a **volunteer resident** to daily wind and adjust it!

The Safeway pictures of the factory are being prepared for a hall display.

Bygones

Jane Austen

Many Basingstoke buildings that she knew are still here:

81, Church Street (now Office Angels, by Glebe Gardens):



This was John Ring's shop, where Jane's father bought her writing slope.

12-14 Cross Street, Windover Mews:



Dr John Lyford lived in this area and visited the Austens.

The Red Lion, London Street, the London Coach & Horse stop:



Goldings, in the War Memorial Park, now the Register Office:



This was the 1780's home of the Russell family (East India Company). The Russells, friends of the Austens, invited them to dances at Goldings.

The old Town Hall was the social centre of the area, where Jane certainly danced. This building was replaced with a grand new Town Hall, now the Willis Museum, but there is a black plaque on the wall on Lloyds Bank, now built on the site.

The Hall has been re-rated after the makeover increased the floor space. Additional sound proofing has been added to reduce adjacent room noise and reduce the echo from the walls. Upstairs painting and flooring have been completed with additional chair storage. The kitchen has been improved with a new cooker for cookery classes. Toilet improvements are being considered. The Hall Manager's office in the Foyer is also still under consideration as it needs many compromises for spatial constraints, impact on the existing space and has to look attractive yet functional.

Bouncy castles often end up bigger than the hall and it is recommended to hire these from Bounce who can provide suitably sized castles to fit our hall low ceiling:
