

# Celebrating 100 Years of Laina Ima'iilah



Brookvale Village Hall hosted this unique 1st Oct 22 event recently. ->

-> It was a glorious occasion of celebration and myth busting about religion, hijab experience, henna and education.

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community was founded in 1889 and is now the largest Islamic community under one leader His Holiness. Mirza Masroor Ahmad. Lajna Ima'illah, commonly known as Laina, is Ahmadiyya Muslim Women's Association, an auxiliary organisation which aims for women to come together to increase their knowledge and spread it.

The association provides all manner of support to women & children across the world. Here in Basingstoke we learnt about the support being provided to attendees at the Dove House School which specialises in special needs.

Sana Hanif. outreach coordinator, hosted the event and was overjoyed with the great turnout and positive feedback from the event which saw women from all paths of life coming together.

#### Sana said:

"The event went very well and everyone was really keen to learn. It was really nice to see and has motivated us to hold further events, which a lot of people have signed up to attend. People have a concept of how Muslim women are, when in fact we are the exact same as any other woman; educated and professionals. The only difference is that we wear a hijab, so it was really nice to provide people with an insight into this."

It was not the sort of thing I really expected to be invited to as a councillor, but I certainly enjoyed it and it was, I think, time well spent.

**Cost of Living Assistance Fund** 

This £1M fund was announced by the local council to help households struggling to pay bills, with grants available to help pay for food and energy and will remain open until these funds are used up. (This is in addition to the national support scheme announced HM government). This scheme provides one-off grants for up to the following amounts:

Up to £1,000 for those on a household income between £0 & £15,000

Up to £500 for those on a household income between £15,001 & £20,000 Up to £200 for those on a household income between £20,001 & £25,000.

# Flashback on Past Pubs

The Harrow Inn was connected with May Street!



The Harrow was in Church Street, beside the river, pulled down in the 1950s but 193 May Street is still here!

The Harrow was first mentioned in 1792, and John May brewers owned it from 1811- and that is the connection.

From 1898 John May wanted to open an ale house in May Street, to be called The Harrow in exchange for the Church Street licence, the area already having over 1,000 residents in the new estate!

However, May Street has restrictive covenants preventing the erection of a public house! ->

-> Although 193 was just outside the edge, there was strong teetotal opposition, and the licence was refused. John May gave up in 1901, on refusal of the third application.

Merton Farm was across the road in this period, which may account for the number of licence breaches that led to its closing in 1903.

The farmstead appears to be Merton Farm in an 1865 Basing-stoke directory naming Henry Portsmouth as the farmer at Merton Farm (Harrod & Co.'s Directory of Hampshire & Isle of Wight, 1865, accessed from Historical Directories online).

Merton Farm, with a farmhouse located on Church Street, was named in memory of Walter de Merton, a benefactor of Basingstoke in the 13th century. In the 1880s Merton Farm was relocated to land in Aldermaston Road, just outside the town (Robert Brown, "Remembering Walter de Merton", Basingstoke Gazette 4/5/06).
