#### Newsletter March & April 2023 Extracts

Call Wait Times depending on receptionists reducing to 20 mins, we continue to monitor. Google Reviews surgery rating 3.9 out of a possible 5. Has your surgery improved during the last year? We can feed back both positive and negative patient comments to Operose.

Dr.iQ feedback is a mixture of satisfaction and deep frustration. Feedback shows Dr.iQ as positive in ordering repeat prescriptions but is poor during surgery contact for appointment/call back. This system can be switched off during regular surgery hours and call backs may not happen per stated timetable. Very annoying when patients are forced to ring the surgery and the first message is that it is best to use Dr.iQ instead of waiting for a phone response!!!

Our PPG volunteers hope to assist with non-clinical tasks within the surgeries which may include:

\* The tidying up of noticeboards by creating a PPG area reflected across all sites.

\* Assisting with some Dr.iQ training for patients on certain days, advertised in advance.

\* Helping patients log in online using the screens in the waiting rooms at peak times.

\* Talking about the PPG to patients and about our function around gaining insights into your experiences.-> -> One of Operose's Digital Team agreed to lead the Dr iQ training project and we will share these training dates once known.

**Operose Meet the Patients** event hosted once again by our local MP, will enable patients to attend and meet the Operose medical & admin team,, probably late summer, dates TBA.

Operose are inviting applicants for surgery reception and administrative posts, please contact Gillies surgery to apply.

Operose are re-designing, improving and merging their CGH & Beggarwood web sites and asked our PPG for our input. We are very interested in helping with the "patient's perspective design".

Blood Test Wait Times continuing challenge with surgery wait times of 2-3 weeks to get a test, followed by almost the same hospital waiting time.

There is a general lack of phlebotomists which affects the whole of the NHS. Two new receptionist/administrators started and three new Clinical Pharmacists onboarding. A new nurse manager will join Operose in June.

A Healthcare Assistant completed her nursing training for a Practice Nurse role. A new Healthcare Assistant was recruited.



The BCA presents The Reinvention of Basingstoke By Bob Clarke BVH Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> August 7:30pm (Free)



This talk describes what Basingstoke was like before the railways came. The disasterous effect of the railway on the innkeeping trades and the reinvention of Basingstoke as a manufacturing centre with the development of Wallis and Steevens' North Hants Ironworks, the arrival of Burberry and , later, the move of Thornycroft from Chiswick. All this led to a massive growth in the built landscape. particularly in Brookvale.
